

Cookies policy

What are cookies?

Cookies are small data files received by the terminal from the website visited which are used to record certain browsing interactions on a website to store data that can be updated and retrieved. These files are stored on the user's computer and contain anonymous data harmless for the computer. The data are used to remember user preferences, such as the selected language, access data or personalisation of the website. They are considered in article 22, Law 34/2002, Services of the Information Society and Electronic Commerce.

Cookies can also be used to record anonymous information about how a visitor uses a site; for example, from whichever website it was accessed, or if an advertising banner was used to access the site.

Why does LACASA ABOGADOS use cookies?

LACASA ABOGADOS uses the cookies strictly necessary for you to use and move freely around our website; as well as to access secure areas and personalise options, for example. LACASA ABOGADOS also uses cookies to collect data related to the analysis of the use of the Internet. These help improve customer service by measuring the use and performance of the Website, and to optimise and personalise it.

Our sites may also have links from other external websites. LACASA ABOGADOS does not control the cookies used by these external websites.

For more information about cookies from social networks or other third-party websites, we advise you to review your own cookies policy.

How we use the different types of cookies

Technical cookies: These are essential for the proper functioning of a Website and to use the different options and services it offers; for example, for session maintenance, response time management, option performance and validation, safety elements and content sharing with social networks.

Customisation cookies: These allow the user to specify or customise certain general Website options; for example, establishing the language, regional configuration or browser type.

Analytical cookies: These are used by our Web portals to develop browsing profiles and to record user preferences to improve the services offered.

Advertising space cookies: These manage advertising spaces based on specific criteria; for example, the frequency of access and the content edited.

Advertising cookies: These manage advertising by storing behavioural information taken from observing habits, studying accesses and forming a user preference profile, to offer advertising related to the interests of the user profile.

Depending on the time cookies are activated, they can also be differentiated as follows:

Session cookies: These cookies are designed to collect and store data while the user accesses a website.

Persistent cookies: These cookies store the data on the terminal and can be accessed and processed during a period established by the person responsible for the cookie, and can range from a few minutes to several years.

Finally, cookies can also be classified according to the entity that manages them:

Proprietary cookies: These are sent to the user's terminal from a computer or domain managed by the Website owner itself and from which the service requested by the user is provided.

Third-party cookies: These are sent to the user's terminal from a computer or domain not managed by the Website owner, but by another entity that processes the data obtained through cookies.

What if I don't want to have these cookies or if I do nothing about it?

To comply with current legislation, we have to ask for your permission to manage cookies. If you decide not to authorise the treatment and indicate your non-compliance, we will use only technical cookies, since they are essential for browsing

our website. In this case, we would not store any cookies. If you continue browsing our Website without denying this permission request, it implies you accept their use.

Bear in mind that, if you reject or delete browsing cookies, we will not be able to maintain your preferences, some features of the pages will not be operational, we will not be able to offer you personalised services and every time you try to enter our website we will have to request your authorisation to use cookies once again.

However, if you decide to modify access configuration to the Website, you should be aware that it is possible to delete cookies or prevent this information from being recorded on your computer at any time by modifying your browser setting parameters:

Internet Explorer cookie settings.

Firefox cookie settings.

Google Chrome cookie settings.

Safari cookie settings.

These browsers are subject to updates or modifications, so we cannot guarantee that they fully conform to your browser's version.

So what does the above information mean?

If you accept our cookies, you allow us to improve the LACASA ABOGADOS Websites to offer you optimal access and give you a more efficient and customised service. In addition, you can configure your browser to establish that only trusted websites or those you are currently browsing can manage cookies; allowing you to select your preferences.

In providing this policy, LACASA ABOGADOS demonstrates its commitment to current legislation on the use of cookies, by providing you with information so you can understand what type of cookies we use and why we do it. Our intention is to provide you with transparency regarding the data processed about browsing our website from your computer.

This policy is periodically reviewed to ensure its validity and so may be modified. We recommend you visit the page regularly where we will inform you of any updates in this regard.
